The itAIS 2011 Young Faculty Symposium is a half-day workshop that aims to provide informal, supportive, and developmental advice to young scholars on their future research agendas. Participants will have the chance to discuss their research projects with internationally esteemed scholars such as Prof. William DeLone (American University, US), and Prof. Dov Te'eni (Tel Aviv University, Israel).

Discussions will be based on an abstract in which candidates will outline their in-progress and/or future research projects. According to the number of participants, subgroups will be formed in order to create a more appropriate environment for a fruitful discussion.

A panel coordinated by Andrea Resca (LUISS Guido Carli University, Rome) will introduce the discussion on what is considered relevant in information systems studies, and on the criteria on which relevance is determined.

To discuss own research projects, it is asked to young faculties to submit an abstract of 300 words via e-mail to info@itais2011.org before the deadline of **September 15th, 2011**. Of course, abstract submission is not a prerequisite to attend the itAIS 2011 Young Scholar Symposium



Professor Dov Te'eni (AIS President) teaches information systems at Tel-Aviv University. He completed his B.Sc. in Economics and Statistics at University College London and his M.Sc. and PhD at Tel-Aviv University, took a faculty position at Case Western Reserve University, moved to Bar-Ilan University and returned to Tel Aviv University. In between, he visited at Oxford, Warrick, National University of Singapore, City University of Hong Kong, Yale, New York University and Nantes, and delivered seminars in numerous other institutions. International collaboration is close to his heart. His research usually combines model building, laboratory experiments and development of prototypes like Spider and kMail, with co-researchers Richard Boland and David Schwartz. Integrative papers on this work appear in Organization Science (supporting distributed cognition) and MIS Quarterly (supporting communication), for which he won best paper award. Dov has served as Senior Editor for MIS Quarterly, is associate editor for Journal of AIS, Information and Organizations, andInternet Research, and has recently become senior editor for the AIS Transactions of HCI.



Professor DeLone is an internationally recognized scholar in the measurement of information systems effectiveness. His article, "Information Systems Success: The Quest for the Dependent Variable" was recently determined to be the most cited article appearing in the top information systems journals over the past 15 years. He is the director of Kogod's Center for Information Technology and the Global Economy (CITGE). As part of the CITGE's research program, he and his colleagues are studying coordination effectiveness and project success in globally distributed software development teams. He is also studying the effective deployment of information and communications technology in developing countries and is the Vice Chair of the Board of Trustees for the University of the Virgin Islands Research and Technology Park, which is developing an e-commerce industry on the island of St. Croix. Professor DeLone has taught at the Kogod School of Business for the last 23 years.
